


Quickly Locating the Full Text of Code and Regulation Sections

You can use citation references to search for documents. It's easy! IntelliConnect provides you with a few avenues to quickly find what you need with just a citation reference.


If You Know the Exact Citation

The quickest way to find a citation reference (if you know its exact format) is to run a search for it from the Home page.

- Type your tax citation in the search box and select go. For example type 179.

- Your document will be the first result in your search list.

Note: If you include the subsection in your code or regulation, you'll be taken to that subsection once you open your document.

Search for a Document Using "citations" in the Quick Bar

- Click the Citations on the Quick Bar. A list of available document categories (i.e., libraries) from which you can search displays in the left pane.
- Select the document category you wish to search. To narrow the list of available templates by subcategory (i.e., publication), click the plus sign <+> next to the category or click the subcategory name.

- The system displays all of the citation templates available for the category selected (and a "free form" citation template at the top of the list) in the right pane.
- With the template displayed in the right-hand pane, enter the requested information in the template boxes (e.g., paragraph, section number, etc.). Click Go or press the <Enter> key to run the citation search. Note how the syntax for that citation is provided for you.

TIP: To find Code and Regulations for federal and state, locate the category "Laws, Regulations and Other Primary Sources" and select "Federal Tax Primary Sources" or "State Tax Law and Regulations – By State."
